The Haysville Police Department has an Animal Control Officer to help protect the needs of citizens as well as animals. It is that officer’s discretion to make determinations on all issues regarding Animal and Fowl.

The Animal Control Officer deals with a wide variety of issues and can be reached through the Police Department at 529-5911.

If you would like to file a complaint regarding an animal related issue you will need to do so at the Police Department located at 200 W. Grand. By filing a complaint you may be required to testify in court to verify the issue.

Understanding the Dog Regulations

Dog Registration.

All dogs of at least six months of age which are owned, kept, maintained or harbored within the City shall be registered with the City within 30 days of acquiring the animal or moving within city limits. This shall be done on an annual basis in accordance to established fees. Failure to obtain and maintain a current registration for each dog may result in penalty fees in addition to the registration fees. The City also requires that your dog have a current rabies vaccination. Many local veterinarians can vaccinate and register your pet at their location. Otherwise for registration you will need to visit the City Clerk Department located at 200 W. Grand. For more information on registrations please call 529-5900.

How Many Dogs Can I Have?

"No person, entity or household shall own or harbor more than four dogs individually exceeding six months of age; more than four cats individually exceeding six months of age; in any combination, more than a total of four dogs and cats individually exceeding six months of age..."

(Haysville Municipal Code)

Unless you have a kennel license through the City, you will only be allowed to own a combination of dogs and cats not to exceed four. Breeding, selling, trading, training or boarding dogs would require you to obtain a kennel license through the City.

Barking Dogs.

"It shall be unlawful for the owner possessor or keeper of any dog to permit such dog, by loud and persistent or habitual barking, howling or yelping, to disturb any person or neighborhood, and the same is hereby declared to be a public nuisance."

(Haysville Municipal Code)

Please be aware of the amount of barking your dog may do and be considerate of you neighbors. Take the necessary steps to keep your dog from becoming a disturbance to the neighborhood. If your dog is consistently barking, and a complaint is made, you may face fines as well as being required to report to court. If you would like to report a barking dog in your neighborhood, please call Animal Control at 529-5911.



Fines.

Impoundment fines are as follows:

1st offense – \$25

2nd offense – \$50

3rd offense – \$75

4th, or subsequent offense – \$100

\$1.00 per day of impoundment shall be charged for the cost of food.

Other fines are as follows:

Animal at Large - \$25

Barking Dog - \$25

No Tag Attached - \$25

Rabies Vaccination Required - \$50

1st offense - \$25

2nd offense - \$35

3rd offense - \$75

Vicious Dogs.

Vicious is any dog:

Which is known to attack without provocation to cause injury, or to otherwise threaten the safety of a human being or domesticated animal;

Which has attacked or bitten a human being or domesticated animal;

That is owned for the purpose of dog fighting;

Which is trained for dog fighting;

Which is known to chase or approach a person upon the streets, sidewalks or any public or private property in an attitude of attack.
