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WATER/WASTEWATER

Water and wastewater services are provided by the city. To begin these services you will need to complete a service application and pay the set-up fee at the Municipal Building, 200 W. Grand. The water meters are read around the first two weeks of each month. Each household is billed monthly at the first of each month for water actually used two months prior. Payments are due by the 20th of each month. If you do not receive your bill in the mail, call the Utility Billing Department at 529-5900 for the amount due. Please contact the Utility Billing Department for a list of the water and sewer rates and fees. *NOTE: Due to our billing process, you will not receive your first bill until the second month of use.*

PERMITS REQUIRED IN HAYSVILLE

If you are planning to do any construction (new building/house, new storage shed, additions, alterations), roofing, siding, plumbing, mechanical work in an existing building (e.g. heating and/or air conditioning, water heater installation, etc.), electrical work, demolition, or installing a fence, you must obtain a permit prior to starting the project. Permits are also required for sewer and water connections. All permits must be obtained at Public Works, 429 S. Jane, and fees paid to the City of Haysville. For more information regarding permits and the permitting process, please call Public Works at 529-5940.

BEFORE YOU START THAT PROJECT...

Do you know where easements and public rights-of-way are located on your property? Do you know for sure where your property's boundaries are located? Do you know where your setbacks are located? It is the property owner's responsibility to locate these components of their property. It is illegal to build any permanent structure on top of an easement or in a right-of-way. If it is necessary to place a fence across an easement, make sure there is a gate at each end for utility maintenance access. Anything located on an easement may be removed by a utility company at the property owner's expense.

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG!

You must call before you dig. This is so that all of the utilities that serve your property can be notified to come to your property and mark the location of their utility lines for safety purposes. If you plan to do any excavating, you need to call:

DOGS AND CATS

- All dogs and cats must be vaccinated against rabies.
- It is against the law for dogs to run loose.
- Any owner of a dog that is six months of age or over is required to purchase a city dog license. Such license can be purchased from local veterinarians at the same time you have your dog vaccinated. If you choose not to purchase the license then, you can buy it at City Hall. Copies of vaccination receipts are forwarded to City Hall. Proof of a current year rabies vaccination is required from a veterinarian. Dog licenses must be renewed annually.
- No person/household shall own or harbor more than a total of four dogs and cats over six months of age in any combination.

HAYSVILLE CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Haysville City Council meets on the second and fourth Mondays of every month. Meeting days are adjusted for Monday holidays and at year end. These meetings are televised live on Cable Channel 7. They are also rebroadcast throughout the weeks following the meeting.

OPEN PUBLIC RECORDS

Most records maintained by public entities are open for inspection and/or copying by individuals. Commonly requested records include: ordinances, policy statements, adopted codes, subdivision regulations, zoning regulations and open meeting minutes. Because all city departments are not located in the same building, it is recommended that you call first to determine where the information you are requesting may be located. You may be asked to submit your request for information in writing. The Kansas Open Records Act authorizes public agencies to charge fees for providing access to or furnishing copies of public records. This fee may be requested in advance.
