

The Regular Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Bruce Armstrong at 7:00 p.m. in the Haysville Municipal Building, 200 West Grand Avenue.

Roll was taken by Administrative Secretary Morgan Capps: Kessler here, Walters here (via Zoom), Rardin here, Ewert here (via Zoom), Benner here, Parton here, Crum here (via Zoom), Thompson here.

Invocation was given by Pastor Greg Hamlin, First Christian Church.

Mayor Armstrong led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Under Presentation and Approval of Minutes, Mayor Armstrong presented for approval the Minutes of February 8, 2021.

Motion by Parton. Second by Benner.

There were no Citizens to be Heard.

There was no Licenses or Bonds presented.

Under Notices and Communications, Mayor Armstrong called for Governing Body Announcements. Councilmember Crum stated the regular Haysville Public Library hours. He gave an update regarding Campus High School's bowling and Scholars Bowl teams. Councilperson Crum stated the Swim-To-A-Wish fundraiser is from February 26th to February 28th. Mayor Armstrong announced upcoming events at the Haysville Senior Center and an update regarding the Haysville Hustle.

Under Notices and Communications, Mayor Armstrong presented a Letter from the Kansas Department of Commerce regarding approval of the Sunset Fields Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Application. Mayor Armstrong also presented a Memo regarding New Businesses for Patriotic Painting LLC. on 152 Alexander Ct., and Dollar Tree on 360 N. Main St. Mayor Armstrong presented a Memo regarding a 2021 Drinking Establishment License for Mi Casita Inc. dba. El Azteca on 111 N. Main St.

There was no Old Business.

Under Other Business, Mayor Armstrong presented for approval Consideration of Agreement with the Kansas Department of Commerce regarding CDBG. He said this is the agreement for the approved grant application.

Under Other Business, Mayor Armstrong presented for approval Consideration of the Replacement Server for the Security Camera System. Mayor Armstrong stated the current server is no longer adequate for the Security Cameras. He said the proposed server would handle the current camera system and would allow for additional cameras. Councilmember Crum asked if the new server is the same brand as the current one with new upgrades, or is there a better option with better deals. Mayor Armstrong stated this is the same company the City's current contract is with, and the new contract will upgrade the server.

Motion by Crum. Second by Parton.

I make a motion we approve the Replacement of the Security Camera Server as presented.

Councilmember Kessler asked when the current contract ends. Mayor Armstrong responded by saying July of this year. Councilmember Kessler asked the length of the current contract, and Mayor Armstrong replied saying it was one year. Deputy Administrative Officer Georgie Carter stated the City has been with this company for two years.

Under Other Business, Mayor Armstrong presented for approval the Consideration of the Pool Pricing for the 2021 Season. He stated only the items in red had increased. Councilmember Parton asked how

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much did the regular price go up. Recreation Director Rob Arneson stated the age group for two through five year olds increased by one dollar. Councilmember Rardin asked how Haysville pricing is compared to surrounding cities. Arneson stated Haysville is lower than surrounding cities.

Motion by Kessler. Second by Rardin.

I make a motion we approve the Pricing for the Haysville Public Pool.

Chief of Police Jeff Whitfield introduced the visiting officer, Sergeant Chad Case. Recreation Director Rob Arneson announced upcoming events.

Under Bills to be Paid, Mayor Armstrong presented for approval the Bills to be Paid for the Last Half of February.

There was no Consent Agenda.

Under Council Items, Councilmember Crum asked Public Works Director Tony Martinez if any plumbing issues surfaced with the City or its citizens. Martinez stated the City did not have issues, but several residents in the Kay mobile home park had frozen pipes. He stated most of the issues were caused from the lack of fastening from the trailer skirts, allowing air to get underneath the trailers and freeze pipes. Martinez stated one service line on Ballard Street did freeze over the weekend, and staff from the water department were able to replace it with a new service line. Councilmember Crum asked Carter if the City can reach out to the businesses that received the federal grant funds and make sure they are aware of the federal government's Paycheck Protection Program. Carter said yes.

Mayor Armstrong presented for approval Adjournment.

Motion by Kessler. Second by Rardin.
